

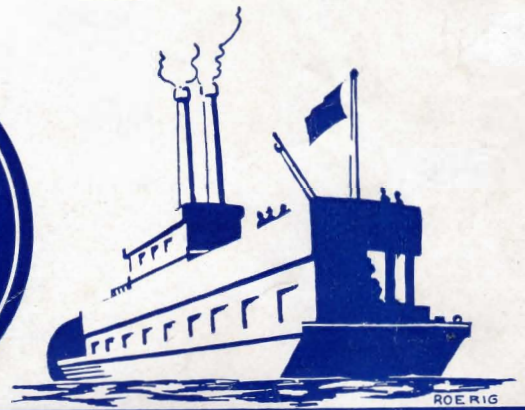
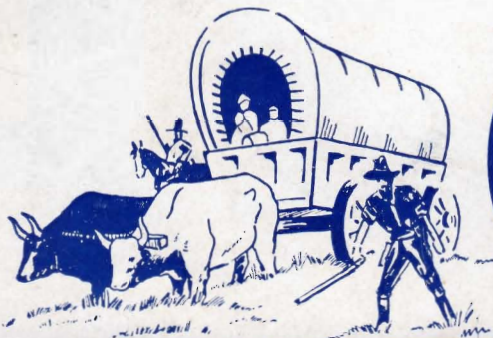

SYNOPSIS OF

“UNDER FIVE FLAGS”

THE STORY of “Under Five Flags” is distinctive, owing to the fact that it applies only to Dubuque and that section of Iowa which borders upon the Mississippi River Valley. Only here, did the Peoples of Iowa serve under five different governments and five different flags.

The first flag to make its appearance was the Fleur de Lis of Bourbon France, brought here in 1673 by Father Marquette and Louis Joliet.

Following the treaty of Paris, in 1762, the region became Spanish Territory and remained under the Spanish Flag until 1800. However, during the year 1780, the English invaded the Mississippi Valley and took possession of the shore line for several months. They were defeated in battle at St. Louis and Spain again controlled the Territory.

In 1800, Napoleon Bonaparte, First Consul of the French Republic, forced Spain to cede the Louisiana Territory, of which Iowa and Dubuque were part. Here France unfurled the Tri-Color; although her possession at this time was brief. Napoleon was in financial troubles and fearful that England might take the Territory, sold it to the United States for \$15,000,000.

EPISODE ONE

“UNDER THE FLEUR DE LIS”

Scene One—(1690)— Nicholas Perrot and a company of French Soldiers arrived at Catfish Creek. Here, Perrot discovered that the Fox Indians were in possession of valuable lead ore mines, so he located a trading post nearby.

Scene Two—(1762)— In Versailles, Louis XV of France, secretly cedes Louisiana Territory to Spain. He entertains the Spanish Ambassador and celebrates the intrigue that has kept England from the Lands West of the Mississippi.

EPISODE TWO

“UNDER THE SPANISH FLAG”

Scene One—(1769)— Spain takes formal possession of Louisiana Territory and unfurls its flag in the Upper Mississippi Valley.

EPISODE THREE

“UNDER THE ENGLISH FLAG”

Scene One—(1780)— The Mississippi Valley is invaded by a Company of British Soldiers under Command of Lieutenant Alexander Kay. They sight a large boat near Turkey River and believing this to be American Rebel Commissary, capture the crew and sack the Cargo.

EPISODE FOUR

"AGAIN UNDER THE SPANISH FLAG"

- Scene One*—(1788)— At Prairie du Chien, Julien Dubuque, a French-Canadian, under the Flag of Spain, arranges for a pow-wow with the Kettle Chieftains of the Foxes and secures the exclusive right to work the Lead Mines at Catfish Creek.
- Scene Two*—(1788)— Dubuque establishes the first permanent white settlement in Iowa at the mouth of Catfish Creek. He christens the "Mines of Spain" and is adopted into the Fox Tribe. This is the founding of the City of Dubuque.

EPISODE FIVE

"UNDER THE FRENCH TRI-COLOR"

- Scene One*—(1803)— Napoleon Bonaparte, in 1800, forced Spain to cede Louisiana Territory back to France, but within three years he sold the Territory to the United States. In New Orleans, an impressive ceremony was performed, when the United States took possession of their purchase.

EPISODE SIX

"UNDER THE STARS AND STRIPES"

- Scene One*—(1810)— Julien Dubuque is claimed by his Maker and is laid to eternal rest on a hilltop overlooking the "Mines of Spain" and the city that is to proudly bear his name.
- Scene Two*—(1830)— Dubuque becomes a community without law and guidance. The Langworthy Brothers, John and Lucius, realizing the need of law and order, select a committee of five, to draw up the "Miners' Compact."
- Scene Three*—(1838)— The Territory of Iowa is established. President Martin Van Buren meets General George Wallace Jones, who championed the bill through Congress and Robert Lucas, who was appointed the first Governor of the Territory of Iowa.
- Scene Four*—(1846)— Iowa is admitted to the Union as a State. The tiny village of Dubuque celebrates.
- Scene Five*—(1861)— Civil War. Dubuque musters her youth to fight for the preservation of the Union. Captain U. S. Grant, of Galena, bids the boys God speed.
- Scene Six*—(1865)— Abraham Lincoln, The Great Emancipator.
- Scene Seven*—(1890)— Dubuque, at the turn of the century, was a town of gaiety and prosperity. Beaus with moustaches, Belles with bustles and bicycles built for two, attend the Firemen's picnic.
- Scene Eight*—(1917)— The Nations of the World engage in the greatest war of all times.
- Scene Nine*—(1938)— Dubuque's 150th Birthday Party.
- Scene Ten*—(1938)— Miss DUBUQUE and her Court.
