IOWA AT SIXTH

History of the Junior Auxiliary of the Visiting Nurse Association

HE JUNIOR AUXILIARY of the Visiting Nurse Association was formed by the V. N. A. board in September, 1932. Mrs. Donald Conzett, who was appointed contact member from the board, ably directed the auxiliary in its infancy. There were eleven charter members, namely Miss Susan Adams, Miss Eugenia Gratiot, Miss Helen Henker, Miss Mary Heles, Miss Mary Kenline, Miss Lucille Loetscher, now Mrs. Laurence Cooley, Miss Esther Nash Myers, Mrs. Clyde Moore, Miss Dorothy Rose, Miss Lenore Roshek, now Mrs. William Ziepprecht, and Mrs. Oliver G. Schrup.

From its inception the aim of the auxiliary has been to further, in every possible way, the work done by the Dubuque Visiting Nurse Association. During the fall of 1932 the members of the new auxiliary rendered valuable assistance in the annual sale of Christmas Health seals sponsored each year by the V. N. A. board. The girls typed 6,000 envelopes and prepared them for mailing or delivered them personally, filed all returns, and conducted the after Christmas follow-up work. As much of this work had been done previously by a commercial mailing service, several hundred dollars were thus saved.

In January, 1933, Miss Lucille Loetscher was elected the first president of the auxiliary and Mrs. Oliver G. Schrup the first secretary.

The members next turned their attention to aiding in every possible way the Milk Fund in which the board was vitally interested. The members kept regular office hours in the Milk Fund office, and they worked for the success of four entertainments for the benefit of the fund.

During July and August the auxiliary members, two each day, spent 475 hours at the Summer Fresh Air Camp as assistants to the teacher in charge. So successful were they in helping make the camp a success that they won the unstinted praise of Miss Kathryne Gabriel, superintendent of the V. N. A. staff nurses.

Again in the fall, the members sponsored the Christmas Health seal sale and, as a preliminary job, typed and realphabetized almost 9,000 new file cards.

During 1933 Mrs. Donald Conzett's place as contact member between the board and the auxiliary was taken by Mrs. Harlow Adams. During 1933 the auxiliary membership increased from 11 to 20 members who spent 1,467 hours in V. N. A. service or an average of 73 hours for each girl. Seventy hours of service a year is the minimum requirement.

In January, 1934, the auxiliary organized a motor corps which has been of valuable service in expediting the work of the nurses, and thus enabling them to make more visits a day. The girls drive every morning a week and several afternoons.

Their program each month becoming more ambitious, the members found it necessary to raise the maximum number of members to 33 during the past year. They meet at least once a month to roll bandages for the staff nurses, and they render assistance in the Open Window room for under-privileged and under-nourished children of grade school age.

During 1934, the Summer Fresh Air camp was kept open eight weeks instead of six as in previous years. The Junior Auxiliary members spent 680 hours assisting at the camp.

The auxiliary secretary keeps two scrap books, one holding clippings and pictures of Junior Auxiliary activities and members, the other including a complete file of Seal sale publicity. The latter book has been sent to several state and district meetings of the National Tuberculosis Association and has received much praise for the splendid seal sale campaign conducted in Dubuque.

A summary of hours spent in Junior Auxiliary service during 1934 gives an idea of the work being accomplished by the members.

Or 773 more service hours than in 1933.

In January, 1935, the members voted to launch upon their first remunerative activity to secure funds with which to buy a car for the use of the V. N. A. staff nurses. The great need for a motorized staff has long been a recognized necessity, therefore it was with great enthusiasm that the members plunged into the work of presenting "Follies of 1935." As this program goes to press, they have every reason to believe that their efforts will be most successful.

The nurses are for the public and it is desired that they be called by all those in need of nursing service.

In all cases, the Nurses work only under the direction of a physician.

Patients are expected to pay from ten cents to one dollar a visit, as their circumstances will allow. The Association has contracts with Metropolitan Life Insurance Co., Woman's Benefit Association and Aetna Life Insurance Co. to give care to their policy holders. This care is paid for by the Company. However, these Companies have certain rules governing their care. Patients who can not afford to pay receive care just as graciously as those who can.

The nurses will not be able to make night or Sunday calls except in emergency cases or the maternity service which is a 24-hour service. Arrangement for this service is to be made through your doctor or the Visiting Nurse Association office.




